

Dear Parents / Carers

While we strive to make school life excellent for your children, we know that there might be times when we fall short of that expectation. It is important to me that, on these occasions, we do everything possible to put things right. In the recent survey you answered the statement 'When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly' in the following way:





This shows that 88% of you have either not raised concerns or agree that they have been dealt with properly. Please keep talking to school staff about any concerns you might have: catch the teacher at the end of the day, email/call or pop into the office, speak to an adult at the gates at the start of the day. We really do want the opportunity to get it right for your family.

Generally speaking, whilst Class Dojo is great for passing short, simple messages, it is not the best way to raise concerns.



SMARTPHONES...

Over recent weeks, I have communicated with a number of parents/carers who have concerns over children's use of smartphones. You may be interested to read the information held here: <u>Smartphone Free Childhood</u> which you could then use to open discussions in your parent forums. From a CJS viewpoint, pupils are only permitted to bring phones to school if they are travelling independently of an adult (although alternative tracking methods are available, e.g. the Apple AirTag). Pupils must hand in their phone at the start of the day and collect it at the end. During the day we are phone-free.




Schedule Example
