SPELLINGS - A MESSAGE FROM OUR WRITING LEADER, MRS SERLE

Next half term, we are trialling a new way of teaching spelling at CJS which we hope will lead to improved writing across the school and improved confidence in the children with regards to spelling. We will be focusing on a 'sound of the week' (phoneme) and the different letter patterns (graphemes) that can make this sound. Teachers will be introducing the sound and the spelling words on a Monday and the children will bring these home to practise throughout the week. The letter patterns and words will be taught in different ways each day and then tested on a Friday. The sounds will be revisited across year groups through progressively more challenging words, building on children's phonics knowledge and the skills they have used previously. If you would like any more information, please speak to your child's class teacher.



Award-winning authors and experts covering a wide range of foodie subjects will entertain you, and four local cookery schools will showcase their skills.
